The EHR CONUNDRUM

Tatiana Melnik, an HIT/privacy lawyer, has put together some points for practices and providers to think through as they are making decisions on IT hosting, interoperability, and data aggregation with third parties (whether it is someone hosting your EMR or the EMR vendor). She also wrote *this article* on EMRs and data ownership.

Some points she encouraged practices and physicians to be cognizant of are:

* Data Sharing and Reimbursement - With the on-going push to transition practices to value based reimbursement, the ability of practices to share data is taking on new importance. As the Merit-Based Incentive Payment System (MIPS) and the Alternative Payment Models (APM) go into effect over the next several years,

practices will be compensated, in part, on their ability to exchange data with other providers. Practices must carefully evaluate the costs involved in facilitating the required data exchange including initial costs and ongoing transaction and maintenance costs as well as the costs to the providers who are receiving the referrals. Specifically, practices should evaluate the extent to which EHR systems and the data sharing costs effectively limit a provider's referral network and patient choice.

* Data Use - Practices should also ask questions about who has access to the practices' EHR data and how that data is used. Many vendors will reserve the right to engage in "data aggregation", "de-identify" data, and develop other analytics and related business uses. But, do you know what this means? Can your practice obtain periodic reports providing more information on how this data is actually used? Is the practice obtaining a benefit from these additional uses and if not, can the practice opt-out? Patients entrust their providers with sensitive information and, regardless of the circumstances, should data be used improperly or there be a data breach, patients will hold the provider responsible. Consider the Target data breach for example; did you know that the Target breach was actually caused by Target's HVAC vendor? If you did, do you know the name of that vendor?
