


POVERTY IN NORTHWEST LOWER MI

OVERVIEW

- NMCAA is the Community Action Agency covering the ten counties of Northwest Lower Michigan: Antrim, Benzie, Charlevoix, Emmet, Grand Traverse, Kalkaska, Leelanau, Missaukee, Roscommon, & Wexford.
- The main office is in Traverse City with satellite offices in Petoskey and Cadillac.
- The three service Departments are: Head Start Child & Family Development, Community Services, and Food & Nutrition

COMMUNITY ACTION IN THE U.S.

- Over 900 Community Action Agencies
- All operating programs helping people achieve greater self-sufficiency, improving communities, and changing lives
- All governed by Boards comprised of 1/3 elected officials, 1/3 low income representatives, 1/3 private sector
- Services and delivery systems locally designed based on Community Needs
- Community Action, through its core fund the Community Services Block Grant, remains the only federal program whose sole purpose is to address poverty issues.

COMMUNITY ACTION IN MICHIGAN

- 29 Community Action Agencies in Michigan covering all counties of the State
- Community Action is the largest provider of human services programs in Michigan other than the state itself.
- Have been recognized nationally for Results
 Oriented Management & Accountability
 (ROMA) Outcomes driven programming

NMCAA

- Incorporated as a Private Nonprofit in 1974
- Combined "One CAP" and "Four CAP", and added Emmet and Charlevoix counties not previously covered by a Community Action Agency.
- Mission: "Linking Services, Resources and Opportunities"
- Method: "Helping people help themselves"
- Vision: "The elimination of poverty in our communities"

COMMUNITY SERVICES EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

- Addresses an immediate need/crisis
- At minimum conduct a household budget analysis
- Conduct basic self-sufficiency assessment
- Connect to programs that can better manage the household's future

COMMUNITY SERVICES HOMELESS PREVENTION PROGRAMS

- Same model as Emergency Assistance
- First stabilize housing situation
- Case management to address causes and plan for future
- 21-county Support Services to Veteran Families program included

COMMUNITY SERVICES HOUSING REHAB & DEVELOPMENT

- Improve existing low-income & affordable housing stock
- Provide safe decent housing
- Increase affordable housing in the region

FOOD & NUTRITION USDA & SENIOR PROGRAMS

- Supplemental programming
- Helps people nutritionally, and to maintain independence
- Often it is this program that is the difference in being able to stay at home

- Umbrella Agency
- Flexible
- Effective & Efficient REGIONAL provider of critical services
- Low overhead: NMCAA Management expense of 3.7%; 96.3% of all funds go to direct service
- Have always depended on the generosity of the community
- Greatest area of need: Meals on Wheels and Emergency Assistance
- Future funding uncertainties=>Diversify revenue streams
