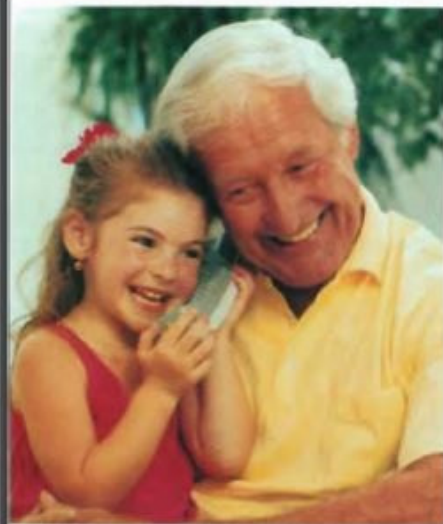

2-1-1 is an easy to remember telephone number that connects people with important community services and volunteer opportunities.
