FamilyWize	Resource for patients without insurance; ensures the lowest price for the medication	http://www.familywize.org/	Any	Longer term (does not lower copays)	FamilyWize essentially acts like a huge consumer group buying service for the uninsured and underinsured. The discounts and savings on medications are provided voluntarily through pharmacies; patient's cost will be the discount price with the FamilyWize card or the pharmacy's usual and customary retail price, whichever is lower.
